Upon processing of your request, the meter of choice will be shipped to the address provided in 48 hours.

Blood Glucose strips are covered by your Prescription Drug Card with a prescription from you physician. Simply take your prescription to a network participating pharmacy with your Prescription Drug Card. The program entitles you to 100 strips per calendar month.

Diabetes Health Facts

Diabetes is the fifth-deadliest disease in the United States. Since 1987 the death rate due to diabetes has increased by 45 percent, while the death rates due to heart disease, stroke, and cancer have declined.

Diabetes can lead to serious complications and premature death, but

people with diabetes can take steps to control the disease and lower the risk of complications.

Diabetes is a chronic disease that has no cure. There are an estimated 20.8 million children and adults in the United States, or 7% of the population, who have diabetes. While an estimated 14.6 million have been diagnosed, unfortunately, 6.2 million people are not aware that they have the disease, 54 million people have pre-diabetes.

Diabetes is associated with an increased risk for a number of serious, sometimes life-threatening complications and certain populations experience an even greater threat. Good diabetes control can help reduce your risk, however many people are not even aware that they have diabetes until they develop one of its complications.
